Careers in the NFL

Educator, Youth and Education, Pro Football Hall of Fame December 11, 10:15-11:15 AM

Grades 5-12

This program examines the importance of education and the hundreds of careers available in and around the National Football League. A 10-minute career video, which examines a wide variety of careers with the San Francisco 49ers organization, is shown during this session. The 50-minute program, which is designed to be highly interactive, is supplemented by a lesson aligned with Common Core/National Standards of Education and is recommended for Grades 5-12. Media and the NFL Educator, Youth and Education, Pro Football Hall of Fame December 11, 9:00-10:00 AM Grades 6-12

This program examines the role of television in the history of the NFL and its impact on viewers. Students will receive an overview of the history of television in the NFL and gain knowledge about the growth of the NFL through television. The topic will also examine the growth of the Super Bowl advertising and TV ratings. This 50-minute program, which is designed to be highly interactive, is supplemented by a lesson aligned with Common Core/National Standards of Education and is recommended for grades 6-12.

Thank you for your interest in the Founding Documents: Building a More Perfect Union distance learning program from the National Archives for grades 6–8! During this program, students will analyze the opening passages of the Declaration of Independence, the Constitution, and the Bill of Rights. They will create a graphic organizer that will help them distinguish the founding documents by their purposes. Next, students will match document excerpts to each excerpt's origin, the Declaration of Independence, the Constitution, or the Bill of Rights. The program will conclude with a discussion about the legacy of these founding documents.

Within this guide, you will find everything you need for the upcoming Zoom program. There is no required pre-program activity for this program; however, you may find it helpful to have your students review the excerpts from the founding documents prior to the program. See attachment below.
