Are there great white sharks in the Gulf of Mexico? What's the difference between a sharks and rays? What adaptations do they have that make them so successful? See the diversity of Alabama's sharks and rays, explore the external and internal anatomy of a shark and learn how our actions can be harmful to shark and ray populations.

Suitable audience: The program **Sharks & Rays of the Gulf** is appropriate for all grades. The program addresses the following disciplinary core ideas: 1) From molecules to organisms: structures and processes; 2) Unity and diversity; and 3) Ecosystems: interactions, energy and dynamics.
